Question 1

Which of the following sentence should be the "FIRST" after rearrangement?

Answer: A

Explanation:

Sentence F introduces the topic and sets the theme of the paragraph. Thus, it should be the first sentence. Sentence C introduces the term Edutor and answers the question raised in Sentence F. Sentence A talks about the motivation of engineers mentioned in sentence C and thus follows sentence C. Sentence E further explains how the engineers want to execute the idea by digitizing school textbooks and how students would not need to carry textbooks. Sentence D continues the idea and tells how student can take tests through tablet and how their teachers can download the tests through Cloud service and thus should follow E. Sentence B further talks about teacher acting on downloaded tests and thus completes the paragraph. So, the correct sequence is F-C-A-E-D-B.

Thus, the first sentence is F.

Question 2

Answer: D

Explanation:

Sentence B introduces the topic of discussion i.e. scenario of energy situation in India. Sentence D should follow it as it tells us about the restrictions in Atomic Energy Programme and that some countries are getting self-reliant in it. Sentence A follows it as it tells the reason why few countries mentioned in D are getting self-reliant as there are items which are made indigenously. C changes the topic of discussion by stating that commercial aspects of exploiting nuclear capabilities are given high priority. Sentence E states that to meet requirements stated in C, India needs commercial level power-generation capability and hence should follow C. F concludes the paragraph by stating that for India energy security is crucial as it imports crude oil and pay for it by precious foreign exchange. So, the sequence is BDACEF.

Thus, the second sentence is D.

Answer: A

Explanation:

Sentence D starts the para as it introduces the writer who was listening to group of Egyptians. F and A should come together as F talks about the writer asking Egyptians questions and A talks about Egyptians answering them. Since all remaining sentences suggest that the author is in his room, FA should follow D. E should come in next as it tells that the author set all the facts that he collected while talking to Egyptians in his file of notes. E is followed by B which suggests that he verified the data with his guide book. Finally, C concludes the para by stating the reasons why the writer had been up to these activities. So, the sequence is DFAEBC.

Thus, the last sentence is C.

Explanation:

Sentence B is the first sentence as it introduces the subjects- the bird catcher, banyan tree, and pigeons. Sentence D should follow it as the 'HE' in it can only be replaced with the bird catcher. Sentence A should follow D as it mentions how woodcutter approached about catching the birds. F follows D because it introduces how pigeons flew down to the foot of banyan tree and as mentioned in E found themselves caught in the net. Sentence C follows E and tells how after being caught in the net, the pigeons lifted the net together. So, the sequence is BDAFEC.

Thus, the third sentence is A.
